President's Report to the Board of Directors

This past month, all our schedules have been full with Building Project meetings. We are closer than ever before on getting that Student Centre in the ground, and we are working our hardest to ensure that no stone is left unturned going through the documents, and that all details are ironed out so that students are able to have a Student Centre that they can operate in the future. In addition to these meetings about the building, we have all been hard at work to continue providing the best we can for our students in the present. This report summarizes the major initiatives I have been involved in over the past month, I am happy to speak to anything I may have missed in putting this report together.

Update from Last Report

Good Neighbour Program

As of yet, the committee hasn't met yet because the Canadore members are unable to attend because of the strike currently in progress. Our plan is to still meet once all members are able to attend and a productive conversation can then be had with both Nipissing and Canadore students being represented.

City Council Meeting

As recommended by Karen Matthews, the leader of the Thibeault Terrace Homeowners Group, at our last community meeting; I attended the North Bay City Council Meeting on October 17th, 2017, to watch her presentation about students in off-campus housing. A lot of people from the Thibeault Terrace Homeowners Group were in attendance, and I was the only student there. The presentation Karen made to the city was to change the by-laws to not allow as many students to be able to rent a single house. She made said her case was not against students but the landlords who live in Toronto and use their neighbourhood as a cash cow by taking advantage of the student population; putting as many possible into a single house to get more

money without care to the damages to the surrounding community. Karen also offered a solution to have a permit/fee given to landlords wishing to rent to students, similar to what is done in Waterloo. Colin Thacker, joined Karen in their presentation, and told the city that the solution is to have a Town and Gown committee put in place. The city was unable to comment because their last change to the city by-laws is currently being challenged by the government. If the city and Thibeault Terrace Homeowners wish to continue with this by-law change, they will have to keep in mind it will apply to the entire city.

Nipissing has taken more of a lead on this issue now, with more updates going to Casey then to NUSU, which is good. Since the last committee meeting, there have been some concerns raised about activity on the Saturday night before Halloween, and I recently became informed that Karen, with a friend and her daughter, did come up the hill to protest on a Saturday that they thought our Open House was happening. Casey Phillips and I will be discussing this further and getting more information from Police Chief Shawn Devine on the matter. One of our Directors, Courtney Ivany, has shown interest in helping us from the student union side in addressing the concerns in the community from students, landlords and homeowners, and promoting the message of the Good Neighbour Program on campus.

OPSEU Strike

The OPSEU Strike is still ongoing and causing delays and stress for our students. I have been in contact with students who are facing some very real concerns about the impact of the strike. Last week, I did put forth the motion to have a strike ad-hoc committee created to address the concerns relating to the strike. I have not received any responses from the committee about when they are able to meet. I did put together a google document for us all to work on to create a game plan of how we can help our students by looking at what issues are at hand, who it is affecting, and what steps we can take to address them.

The Students who have contacted me have been understanding of NUSU's limitations in this situation. I am very happy to hear from all students who are being affected because NUSU is not an all-knowing entity and needs students to speak to us to let us know what is happening from their perspective. These student leaders, are the reason why change can happen, and they have been all more than willing to help us find solutions and put them into action.

Student Advocacy with the Equity Centre

Due to certain circumstances, there was a week from which I completed all of my work outside of the office. This was a great opportunity to talk with our students on a one-on-one level. From these points of contact, one of the issues raised to me was the process in which a student is able to put forth a complaint they have with a professor. During this week, I was also invited to attend a meeting at the Equity Centre, where they were also looking into the process. They had met with NUFA and they were told that there were some ambiguities in the current procedure within the university. I will be looking into the process through conversations with the

Deans, and the Equity Centre will be looking into the current policies and procedures written in Nipissing by-laws and policies, as well as anything that may be in a contractual agreement with unions. The next step is to speak with Arja, Nipissing's Vice-President Academic. The goal is to make the process more clear and accessible to students.

Other Suggestions from Students During my Time out of Office

- NUSU Newsletter to let them know when events are and what is going on in the school.
- Having the AGM more accessible by including closed-captioning on the live feed, and assisted hearing for those present.
- Having the minutes from the AGM circulated to students after the AGM that year and not just with the agenda for next year.
- Having more opportunities for students to create change and make meaningful votes during AGM's (such as building project decisions or events to be had)
- Having polls that are used to gage interest on events and topics when we look to plan events sent out through email to all students.
- Have Board meetings in the Vic Fideli Room at a regular time and place so that they are more accessible to students wishing to attend.
- Students think the Pepsi machine in the student lounge is still broken.
- Having Executives out of office more so they are able to engage with students.
- Having a bursary made for Spring/Summer courses.

General Involvement

November 11th - Remembrance Day Ceremony at Memorial Gardens

J'aime and attended the Remembrance Ceremony at Memorial Gardens. The event was well attended and NUSU purchase a wreath to be laid at the cross, with all proceeds donated being put in 'Trust' to be used to purchase medical equipment and services for Veterans, Ex-Service personnel, their widows and dependants.

Vice-President Governance & Legal Affairs' Update for the Board of Directors

Introduction

This document outlines my update to the Board of Directors of the tasks I have been working on since the last board meeting on October 24th, 2017. Note that this report is not exhaustive. If you have any questions about my day-to-day operations, do not hesitate to reach out.

MFRC

The mental health first aid for the veteran community training took place on campus November 4th and 5th. Several NUSU members, including myself, participated, as well as some of our students who are either connected with the military or have an interest in working in the mental health field after graduation. There were also several military members in the session, including one individual who has been deployed five times. The diversity in the group created for great discussion and gave students and our staff some insight into the challenges the military folks face when transitioning into civilian life.

I circulated a few questions and here is the feedback we received from Tina Thomason...

1) <u>Do you believe it would be worthwhile to run something like this on campus again next</u> semester?

I think it would be beneficial to run the course on an ongoing basis. I think I may have seen a website that listed the training programs available at Nipissing and it included the MHFA for youth as well as some other programs through the Mental Health Commission. Is there a way to keep a record of students who express interest in the Veterans version and once there is a minimum of 8 participants we can organize the date and time? Is there a way to list the Veterans version on the same site as the other versions offered through Nipissing?

2) What type of feedback did you receive on the training?

The feedback was all positive. Even a participant who took the youth version of the course said this version was very different, and was not repetitive as far as content and activities. It was mentioned that people enjoyed having military members and family members' feedback so it will be important to have a mixed group again like we did this time.

3) Is this someone you would like to run at other institutions in the future (i.e. Laurentian and Algoma)? If so, I can reach out to them.

I will eventually be offering it in all of the communities I serve and it would be very helpful to have another organization assist with the planning, etc. It would be a great way to get some of the other universities on board with supporting a partnership like ours. I have people in Sault Ste. Marie waiting for a course to be offered there, so if we are going to prioritize any community I would start there.

4) <u>Is there anything more that NUSU could have done/can do in the future to help promote / strengthen the program?</u>

You guys are great and doing and amazing job! I have heard there are some professors who have an interest in PTSD and with Veterans in particular. I just brought some students and a professor on a tour of the Operations Floor last week. They were from the Criminology department I believe. There is a prof in the Sociology program that has a guest speaker come and talk about PTSD, and there may be interest from the Family related programs to learn about our partnership and how we can help them in their classes.

Committees

Elections: a joint meeting occurred between the elections committee and our communications department to discuss how we will be advertising the elections this year. A much heavier focus will be placed on debunking some of the myths about the executive positions (i.e. needing to have "NUSU experience" to be elected). At the time I write this, the tentative plan is to begin advertising on November 20th. Courtney and I will also be hosting a drop in information session for students to come learn more about the executive positions.

It is also worth noting that elections for this committee will be necessary now that Dan and Tyrel have stepped down.

Other

Building Project: Shane and I sat down with Anthony Rota and Nathan Jensen to talk about the new student center. Nathan highlighted some of the key elements he has been working on and displayed the drawings of the facility, while Shane and I asked about the potential to receive Federal Infrastructure grants. Rota provided us with contact information for a granting agency and said to reach out to him for support if we submit an application for funding.

Meeting with Dr. Arja Vainio-Mattila: per the old VPGLA job description, part of the role is to communicate regularly with the Vice-President Academic and Research (VPAR) at Nipissing on topics surrounding academic advocacy. In meeting with Arja, who is now a month into her new role as Provost and VPAR, she noted a couple of concerns that she has already seen that she would like to address to help students and said that he is looking to work closely with students to gain their perspective when making important decisions.

We also discussed the possibility of teaming up to host the Chamber of Commerce Business after Hours event. This is something that Nipissing is interested in partnering on. Arja and I will be working on a document that will brainstorm ideas for this event to get the most out of it for our students. I will be typing up my notes from this meeting and will circulate them to the Board once they are finished.

Entrepreneurship Event: You may recall that in one of my summer reports, I mentioned that I had met with Richard Fortin and Tealia Carriere to discuss hosting an entrepreneurship event for students. I have been in contact with Tealia since the summer and her idea finally came to fruition with the Inspire and Unite event on November 2nd. The event was not as well attended as they had hoped, but it was a good starting point to help bridge the gap between students and the community's entrepreneurs.

Board of Governors and Academic Senate: Shane, J'aime and I attended the Board of Governors meeting on November 9th and Tyrel and I attended academic senate on November 10th. We delivered reports to each body that updated them on the building project, the Movember campaign, Tealia's entrepreneur event, and the MFRC partnership. We also asked the following questions at senate...

- 1) Since there is no academic senate at Canadore, our understanding is that the academic decision makers once the strike is over are the Canadore administration. What steps are being made to ensure that the best interests of Nipissing students are being taken into consideration?
- 2) With other colleges looking to extend semesters, have night classes and possibly classes on weekends, how will this impact the Nipissing students who are in programs affiliated with Canadore?
- 3) What financial barriers are there for students in regards to this strike and how will Nipissing help students with this?
- 4) Has the university also taken in consideration how this will impact the anniversary celebrations at the end of this month?

Strike: on the theme of the college strike, as previously mentioned in an email to the Board, I have spoken to Mike DeGagne and Cheryl Sutton. Sarah and I also sat down with Rick Vanderlee since the nursing, criminal justice and online business programs are the ones that are primarily affected. We asked what steps are being taken to limit the impact of the strike, the types of contingency plans that are in place for making up class time and if there is anything that NUSU can do to help.

Moving Forward

Elections: a lot of my time over the next two months will be coordinating elections. The policy and job descriptions will need to be reviewed again, I will be meeting with the Blackboard team to ensure a smoother voting process, and as mentioned earlier in the report, Courtney and I will be hosting an information session.

The Investment Policy Statement was at a bit of a standstill, however following a meeting with Rachael Costello from CIBC, it is picking up again. I plan on speaking with Adam Boyle in the next month or so to fill in some of the cracks in the statement so that we can get the investment ball rolling.

Sponsorship and NUSU Perks+

Sponsorship progress has slowed down somewhat this past month since there has been a greater focus on other projects. However, prior to leaving for my trip to Japan on October 4th, 2017, I sent out e-mails to members of NUSU Perks+ to notify them that it is fully functional on the app. I also reached out to all of our sponsors on behalf of Tyrel and Sarah in order to provide them with the opportunity to participate in Wellness Wednesdays. We received some great feedback, along with another monetary donation from CIBC and in-kind donations from GoodLife and Sugardaddy. Additionally, Popeye's visited us and provided us with \$250 worth of giveaways that we can use however we see fit. I also had a great meeting with Grounded Studios where they gave NUSU some in-kind donations, including monthly/yearly memberships. They have expressed a high level of interest in planning events with us this year, so I plan to sit down with J'aime soon, in order to discuss what we can do with them going forward. Moreover, I plan to reach out to both Booster Juice and Freshii shortly – I'd love to work with them and I think it would be a great way to provide them with some additional exposure.

NUSU Perks+ has a few adjustments that need to be made to it, we are just awaiting our app provider to make the adjustments. There has not been much feedback on the app from students unfortunately, but I hope that these adjustments will help alleviate that. Regardless, I am very happy that this idea has come to fruition during my term. It can only go up from here.

Clubs and Societies

J'aime and I have been scheduling meetings with clubs and societies, which was done mainly to keep everyone on the same page. So far, the only interaction we have had with many clubs was at the Club Summit Meeting, which we feel may not have been enough for certain clubs. Meeting face to face is important for us so that we can make sure that there is no confusion moving forward. So far, these meetings have been going great.

Societies that are under us have been inquiring about their portion of funding, which is being granted through the Society ancillary fee. This initiative, while a fantastic idea, did not have much planning in terms of its execution. We have only recently been given a portion of this fee for the Fall term, however, we have received it in bulk. Each student pays \$0.50/3 credit course towards this fee, so I had to request a detailed breakdown of courses taken based on current major. Given that enrolment is constantly adjusting and that there are students with double majors/minors/electives, it has proven to be a far more complicated task than I had initially thought. The detailed breakdown I had received from the registrar was "the first time" that they had given out the document, since they have never needed to provide that information before. Luckily, as of the submission of this report, I seem to have been able to figure out which amounts to remit to each of our societies. The remaining balance will be placed in a separate account, where we can hold it for an undetermined amount of time (dependant on how much we receive for each program). What happens to these funds after a set period of time is currently being discussed. Ultimately, the goal is to provide each program currently without a society the ability to eventually start one.

Miscellaneous

Building Project: The bulk of my efforts this past month has been going towards this project. As outlined in Cooper's report, we had a meeting with Anthony Rota so that we could explore any potential opportunities for grants. The University and NUSU have also continued the discussion on their fundraising campaign and the role that this project will play in it—there was a meeting with Len Gamache where a large chunk of these details were finalized. Unfortunately, I was absent for that meeting. Discussions with the University have been ongoing, as there is a lot for us to still iron out in the coming weeks, but we are finally making significant progress in these discussions.

The largest portion of this project that I have been responsible for is working alongside KPMG so that we can finalize a sustainable financial model moving forward. This is not only to ensure that NUSU can and will be able to remain in operation for the foreseeable future, but also to be able to provide a concrete plan to potential lenders. This model has been completed and sent off to lenders, some of which have submitted offers. Ultimately, it seems like many people are finally on the same page.

Audit and Finance Committee: We had a brief meeting to go over the lender options submitted to us by KPMG. It was imperative that we figured this out prior to an emergency board meeting on November 1st, so that we would be able to explain all the financial jargon to our board members.

Investments: While it has been hectic around the office as of late, Cooper and I were able to schedule a quick meeting with Rebecca Rams from CIBC so that we could breathe some more life into this initiative. We had received our portion of ancillary fees from the University and, with that information, we were able to provide her with concrete numbers. She had provided us with three (3) separate investment options along with a recommendation. However, before continuing with this, Cooper and I must sit down and finalize the Investment Policy Statement (IPS). We plan to meet with Adam Boyle again in the near future so that we can finalize it and present it to the board.

Insurance: Our insurance has been renewed for another year. This had to be finalized before I left for my trip to Japan, so I made sure to leave all the necessary materials with Cooper and Mira prior to leaving. Luckily it seemed to be relatively easy to get everything put together, so it wasn't an arduous task that I had left them.

I had also schedule a meeting with Coleen Patterson and Chris Bevan (both filling in for Peter Rooney's absence) in which we could discuss our insurance and coverage moving forward. Due to our current assets decreasing significantly we have managed to save around \$1,500 compared to last year. Since we have accomplished saving-some money, they presented us with other forms of insurance that we may want to consider. This is something that the executives will be taking a look at and making a decision on in the near future.

Movember: I'm very happy with how Movember has been going, and I'm excited to have been able to contribute towards this cause on NUSU's behalf. Hopefully this doesn't slow down, and we keep pushing forward.
