- International fees:
 - Universities around the province are receiving lower funds from the government; the government provides no funding for international students
 - International students not to be seen as a commodity (international students pay significantly higher tuition than domestic students)
 - extra supports and systems
 - international students <u>do</u> pay taxes (\$8 billion to the province of Ontario in 2019)
 - Board of Governors discussions: internationalisation and diversity on campus; money should come from investment into those students, not commoditizing them; looking at having the government restrict hikes to international student tuition
 - 2 or 3% cap on tuition every year
 - freeze on international tuition with an offer of acceptance
 - provincial and municipal stand-point: international students contribute to our economy and population growth

MACCARTHY expressed concern regarding the volume of responses the VPSL would be receiving.

MACKIE suggested that the email disclose an opportunity for students to decline their position within a certain time frame but that students will not have to respond accepting their position.

MACKIE said that other student unions in the province have other students who are not affiliated with them chair their meetings.

WINTER expressed concern with low-turnouts for elections.

MACKIE said that community members could be chairs, so long as they sign a confidentiality agreement. A third option is that CFS supplies chairs for free if need-be.

SULLIVAN asked if they would get a community member for us.

MACKIE stated that it would likely be a representative from CFS.

SULLIVAN asked how we would assess the credentials of the community members as chairs.

MACKIE suggested going through the North Bay Chamber of Commerce.

SULLIVAN expressed concern regarding last minute meetings and the availability of the external chair.

MACKIE said that there could be a vice-chair which would likely be the President.

WINTER said that in best practice, it would be best to explore it further.

MACKIE said that she can explore all options and bring it to the next board meeting.

WINTER asked about having a staff member chair board meetings.

FOSTER and MACKIE stated that it could be a conflict of interest depending on the topics being discussed, especially in closed session.

MACKIE stated that the chair of the Board of Governors is a community member and is present for both open and closed sessions.

WINTER asked if the board dissolved the policy stating that the vice-chair can only be an executive member and opening that position to a director.

MACKIE stated that she is unsure if it ever happened but that she will look into it.

10. Question Period:

MUYLAERT asked about the progress of the student centre and hiring for the restaurant.

SULIVAN said there is a soft plan for hiring restaurant/bar staff. It will likely happen in mid-summer.

MACKIE said that the Kitchen Manager position will likely be hired at the end of May and the rest of the positions may be in August.

COOPER asked if the building construction was still on-schedule.

MACKIE confirmed.

WINTER asked when the Kitchen Manager will be hired to start planning.

MACKIE stated that the position will likely be open for a month and the person will be hired sometime at the end of June.

WINTER asked how that timeline would look for them to come in and help with the planning of the restaurant

MACKIE confirmed.

SULLIVAN stated that there will be two operating budgets: one for NUSU's operations and one for the restaurant and bar.

SULLIVAN said that without this, the Director of Finance is often perceived externally as a bookkeeper.

WINTER asked what she would be able to sign-off on.

SULLIVAN said any major purchases.

MUYLAERT asked if there would have to be another signing authority within NUSU.

MACKIE said yes, as most places require at least two signatures anyway.

The directors present were not comfortable to decide on anything as the material was not circulated before the time of this meeting.

MACKIE asked that this be tabled so the materials could be circulated and voted-on electronically.

Campaigns

Eco- Green Week

For the week of February (3-7th), the campaigns team and I ran an eco-green week in partnership with the Green Initiatives Committee. On Monday, we ran an Instagram quiz to educate our students about ecofacts and bust myths. This was viewed often and the viewer was consistent. On Tuesday and Thursday, we ran a tap versus bottled water challenge. This was well responded to and had continued support for each day. On Friday, we posted a green information graphic designed for students. This was a great way to end off the week.

Consent Week

Meghan Walker, the Sexual Violence and Prevention Educator, planned a consent week filled with events to educate students about consent. Meghan Walker, The Studio, Criminal Justice Society, Amelia Rising, and I planned a Zumba night to raise money for Amelia Rising and educate the community and students about the services Amelia Rising provides. The Zumba night raised \$203.05 for Amelia Rising! Meghan Walker and Amelia Rising gave away swag for people to grab and to raise awareness about their services. Menstruation Matters Campaign

The Menstruation Matters Campaign was sparked at Ryerson University and has gained traction in other Ontario universities. The goal is to put pressure on the provincial government to provide government-funded menstruation products for post-secondary students. The petition to present at Queen's Park was distributed on Friday and was presented at the Wellness Week events to gain signatures. Wellness Week

Wellness week is happening this week! Monday, we ran our grab and go event and held a Disney Plus Extravaganza. The grab and go event was a morning event, where we gave muffins, and other breakfast foods to students on their way to class. The Disney Plus Extravaganza was held in the student lounge where we set up snacks and Disney movies for students to watch between classes. On Tuesday, we ran our Act Like a Kid Day. Lemonade Day is an idea that NUSU brought to the Young Professionals committee who then in turn partnered with the Business Centre Nipissing Parry Sound. This initiative promotes young kids between 8 and 12 to set up a lemonade stand and learn about entrepreneurship, leadership, budgeting, marketing and more. Nipissing University is a sponsor of this event and we attended the official launch of the program.

For Indigenous Week we shared facts and translation information that was provided by Indigenous Initiatives on our social media. We were contacted by a few student unions who were impressed that we were using our social media to educate our students. We are hoping to continue to build this relationship and help support initiatives from this office.

International Symposium

NUSU was invited to the Nipissing University International Symposium. Charlotte and I attended on behalf of NUSU. This event was hosted by Dr. Arja and Dr. Casey Phillips and included a panel of international students. Summer Events Coordinator

All throughout the month of January, we were accepting applications for the new summer position of Summer Events Coordinator. After interviewing all qualified candidates the first week of February, we offered the position to Alexander (Xander) Winter, who accepted and signed his confidentiality form and employment contract. Since hired, Xander has been involved heavily with Frosh Coordinator and Leader interviews, brainstorming themes, organizing the week's schedule, etc. He is proving to be a great asset to the NUSU Services department.

Building Site Visit

Xander also attended this site visit, as we were looking at the space for ideas and inspiration on events, Frosh Week, and bar nights. 2020 Frosh Coordinators

Frosh Coordinator interviews took place the second week of February. Due to the minimal applicants, we reached out to individuals we thought would be great and should apply, and interview. Consent Week; Movie Night & Sexy Trivia

The NUSU Services department collaborated on two events she was running during the week; Movie Night on Wednesday, February 26th and Sexy Trivia on Friday, February 28th.
