The campaigns committee has met twice since the last board meeting and has planned campaigns until the month of September. We are currently doing research on more event ideas and planning the final details. Allie and our intern Nicole have been working on graphics for the summer and the academic year for us to post throughout the year.

CFS Conference

For five days this month I attended the semi-annual CFS conference in Kanata, Ontario for five days. For this conference I went to the following meetings: Ontario Provincial meetings, Women's Constituency, Small Institutions Caucus, and Campaigns Forum. These meeting are to flag the needs of students to CFS national executives, and in return, the CFS executives provide resources and campaign ideas for schools to participate in.

The main topic during the Ontario Provincial meetings was the Student Choice Initiative. No new information was presented, other than their "We the Students" campaign is expanding nation wide. At the last Ontario meeting we had the chance to talk to other schools and to brainstorm how to advertise fees to their students. The common theme for schools in Ontario is to use social media to advertise fees.

The Women's Constituency meetings was a chance for us to discuss women's issues on campus.. The main topic of discussion was how to support female identified students on our campus.

For the Small Institutions Caucus meetings, there was talk about how the Student Choice Initiative may impact the smaller schools. There was also talk about how the CFS could support the smaller schools, as well as how to run successful events that are low budget.

During the Campaigns Forum meetings, the CFS National Executives provided a long list of new campaigns that they are hoping to launch. They have a general goal for their campaigns this year which is "to campaign around human rights issues with an environmental and financial needs approach." The main campaigns mentioned was the Green New Deal and the Time to be Bold campaign.

Student Advocacy

There has not been any new student advocacy issues presented to NUSU at this time. I have been attending weekly meetings about student appeals which are going well.

Sarah's Report

Clean, Green, Beautiful North Bay

We are looking to do a clean up on campus in July and I am waiting to hear back from the Biology Department about facilitating it. We want Nipissing University and NUSU to be extremely engaged partners in this. Cristin Christopher has been great at working with us on many projects, including this one.

Community Engagement

We have made sure to keep up our community engagement including supporting Armed Forces Day, Timmies Camp Day, McHappy Day, MFRC Day, Bay Days, Poutine Fest, National Indigenous Peoples Day and the announcement of the economic impact Indigenous peoples have in North Bay. We have had great response from the community about our community engagement and have built great relationships due to it.

TP North Bay

Toilet Paper North Bay team collected 24,680 rolls of toilet paper which was distributed to 12 North Bay food banks including the NUSU Student Food Bank.

Political Landscape

Warren, Shannon, Mira and myself attended a luncheon with the Minister of Economic Development. Two days later there was a cabinet reshuffle and now Vic Fedeli, MPP of Nipissing-Timiskaming, holds that title. As I am on the Labour Market Group Board of Directors this will definitely allow us a further insight into the economic scale of not only

Other student unions are doing this and I think it makes sense for us to also do it considering how many of our students needs OSAP. It will also help us figure out where we will be with ancillary fees.

Convocation

Fifty-Two Coffees

I met with Adam Mclandres from PosPro Financial and Kennedy Horton from the business center. Adam and I discussed the option for the summer jobs they offer to students to be RSD approved. The program offers an opportunity that benefits students and North Bay.

Building Update

The building's foundation is almost completely finished. The elevator shaft is constructed and the waterproof membrane has been added. The steel frames for the study nook have also been installed. The night club walls are beginning to form and should be up to the second floor in the next two weeks. Overall, according to the building contract, construction is progressing as planned. Swap/Interest Rate

Per our last meeting, there was a larger question regarding what our offigional rate was. The swap consisted of a swap between floating rate (current rate + stamping fee) & fixed rate (3.762%) NUSU will be paying interest based on a fixed rate of \$3.762% (Base rate 2.512% + 1.25% Stamping fee) instead of the actual or current rate. There was no fixed rate previously because it was a floating rate which changed every minute.

Interns

NUSU has hired two new interns through the Canada summer jobs program. We have welcomed Lee Rockburne and Nicole Seeley as our sponsorship and administration interns. The intern's salary will be supplemented by Canada summer jobs.

Mira's Report

"Over the past month, the Finance Department has worked on various administrative and financial tasks to improve NUSU's financial status and administrative performance. The Finance and Administration Department plans to continue implementing strict budget compliance which is our driving focus to maintain NUSU's financial stability and sustainability.
