General Update

• Over the last month I have met with several individuals and groups. I met with Brock University Student Union to discuss the process they follow for student group elections. This conversation was to find ways to improve, standardize and simplify the election process for our student groups. Student Groups Update

 Student group Elections began February 28, 2022. Each student group is able to run their elections individually or with the assistance of NUSU. The nomination period began on February 28th and will continue until March 10th. NUSU will

review all nominees and place them on the voting list for the respective student group. The voting process begins on March 15th and continues until March 18, 2022. Results from the elections will be shared on March 21st, 2022. Student groups are encouraged to host information sessions with their membership prior to or during the early stages of the election period to provide their members an opportunity to learn and ask questions regarding current executive positions. It is also recommended that following the election period, current executives host a shadow period for the incoming executives to learn their role before changeover at the end of the semester. This should be a week or so of time dedicated to reviewing contact information and important documentation.
